ἀπόστολος

of messengers with extraordinary status, especially of God's messenger, envoy, of a group of highly honored believers with a special function as God's envoys, one who proclaimed the gospel

one who fulfills the role of being a special messenger, apostle, special messenger

διὰ

marker of instrumentality or circumstance whereby something is accomplished or effected, by, via, through, of efficient cause, via, through, 'by the will of God'

marker of the means by which one event makes another event possible, by means of, through, by

θελήματος

the act of willing or desiring, subjective sense, will, as a rule of the will of God

that which is purposed, intended, or willed, will, intent, purpose, plan

κατ'

marker of norm of similarity or homogeneity, according to, in accordance with, in conformity with, according to, to introduce the norm which governs something

marker of a relation involving similarity of process, in accordance with, in relation to

ἐπαγγελίαν

declaration to do something, with implication of obligation to carry out what is stated, promise, pledge, offer, of God's promise, 'in accordance with the promise'

the content of what is promised, promise

ζωῆς

transcendent life, life, the life of the believers, which proceeds from God and Christ, of eternal life

to be alive, to live, life

ἀγαπητῶ

pertaining to one who is dearly loved, dear, beloved, prized, valued, indicating a close relationship, especially that between parent and child

pertaining to one who or that which is loved, object of one's affection, one who is loved, beloved, dear

τέκνω

one who is dear to another but without genetic relationship and without distinction in age, child, of a spiritual child in relation to master, apostle, or teacher, cf. Philem 10
a person of any age for whom there is a special relationship of endearment and association, my child, my dear friend, my dear man, my dear lad

χάρις

a beneficent disposition toward someone, favor, grace, gracious care/help, goodwill, in Christian epistolary literature from the time of Paul, with the sense (divine) favor in fixed formulas at the beginning and end of letters
a favorable attitude toward someone or something, favor, good will

ἔλεος

kindness or concern expressed for someone in need, mercy, compassion, pity, clemency, of God toward humans
to show kindness or concern for someone in serious need, to show mercy, to be merciful toward, to have mercy on, mercy

εἰρήνη

a state of well-being, peace, in a farewell greeting, welfare, health
a set of favorable circumstances involving peace and tranquility, peace, tranquility
