### V. 16

#### πρώτη

pertaining to being first in a sequence, inclusive of time, set (number), or space, first of several, of time, first, earliest, earlier  
first in a series involving time, space, or set, first

#### ἀπολογία

the act of making a defense, defense, in court, 'at my first defense'  
to speak on behalf of oneself or of others against accusations presumed to be false, to defend oneself, 'when I first defended myself, no one stood by me'

#### παρεγένετο

AMdepI3sg

fr. παραγινομαι

to come to help, stand by, come to the aid of  
to come to the assistance of someone, to come and help, to present to help, 'no one came to help me'

#### ἐγκατέλιπον

AAI3pl

fr. ἐγκαταλειπω

to separate connection with someone or something, forsake, abandon, desert, cf. v. 10  
to desert or forsake a person and thus leave that individual uncared for, to desert, to forsake

#### λογισθείη

APOpt3sg

fr. λογιζομαι

to determine by mathematical process, reckon, calculate, count, take into account  
to keep records of commercial accounts, involving both debits and credits, to put into one's account, to charge one's account, to regard as an account'

#### παρέστη

AAI3sg

fr. παριστημι

to be present in any way, be present, come to the aid of, help, stand by someone  
to cause to be in a place, to present (oneself), to cause to be

#### ἐνεδυνάμωσέν

AAI3sg

fr. ἐνδυναμωω

to cause one to be able to function or do something, strengthen, of God or Christ, who give power, cf. 1 Tim. 1:12, Phil. 4:13  
to cause someone to have the ability to do or to experience something, to make someone able, to give capability to, to enable, to strengthen, to empower

#### κήρυγμα

a public declaration, something proclaimed aloud, proclamation, of apostolic proclamation  
the content of what is preached, preaching, what is preached

πληροφορηθῆ                      APS3sg                      fr. πληροφορεω  
fill (completely), fulfill, fill out, complement, fulfill your ministry, cf. v. 5  
to fully accomplish one's task, to perform one's complete duty, to finish fully one's task, to  
accomplish satisfactorily

ἀκούσωσιν                      AAS3pl                      fr. ἀκουω  
to hear and understand a message, understand  
to believe something and to respond to it on the basis of having heard, to accept, to listen to, to  
listen and respond, to pay attention and respond, to heed

ἐρρύσθην                      API1sg                      fr. ῥυομαι  
to rescue from danger, save, rescue, deliver, preserve, 'be saved from the jaws of the lion' cf. v.  
18  
to rescue from danger, with the implication that the danger in question is severe and acute, to  
rescue, to deliver

στόματος  
mouth, of animals and animal-like beings, mouth, jaws, of a lion, in imagery  
mouth

λέοντος  
lion, 'be rescued from the jaws of the lion, i.e. from great danger' cf. 1 Pet. 5:8  
lion

## V. 18

ῥύσεταιί                      FMdepI3sg                      fr. ῥυομαι  
see above

ἔργου  
that which displays itself in activity of any kind, deed, action, deed, accomplishment, of the  
deeds of humans, exhibiting a consistent moral character, 'evil deeds', cf. v. 14  
that which is done, with possible focus on the energy or effort involved, act, deed

πονηροῦ  
pertaining to being morally or socially worthless, wicked, evil, bad, base, worthless, vicious,  
degenerate, of things  
pertaining to being morally corrupt and evil, immoral, evil, wicked

σώσει                      FAI3sg                      fr. σωζω  
to save or preserve from transcendent danger or destruction, save/preserve from eternal death,  
from judgment, and from all that might lead to such death, e.g. sin  
to cause someone to experience divine salvation, to save

### βασιλείαν

the act of ruling, especially of God's rule, the royal reign of God, cf. 4:1  
to rule as a king, with the implication of complete authority and the possibility of being able to pass on the right to rule to one's son or near kin, to rule, to be a king, to reign, rule, reign

### ἐπουράνιον

pertaining to being associated with a locale for transcendent things and beings, heavenly, in heaven  
related to or located in heaven, heavenly, in heaven, pertaining to heaven

### δόξα

honor as enhancement or recognition of status or performance, fame, recognition, renown, honor, prestige, 'praise is or be to God'  
to speak of something as being unusually fine and deserving honor, to praise, to glorify, praise

### αἰῶνας

a long period of time, without reference to beginning or end, of time to come which, if it has no end, is also known as eternity  
unlimited duration of time, with particular focus upon the future, always, forever, forever and ever, eternally
