

## 2 Tim. 4:6-8 mws

### V. 6

ἤδη

point of time prior to another point of time, with implication of completion, now, already, by this time

point of time preceding another point of time and implying completion, already

σπένδομαι

PPI1sg

fr. σπεινδω

offer a libation/drink-offering, of the apostle who is about to be offered up, to shed his blood as a sacrifice, cf. Phil. 2:17

to pour out an offering as an act of worship or ritual observance, to pour out an offering

ἀναλύσεώς

departure, euphemism, of departure from life, death

to depart from life, as a euphemistic expression for death, to leave this life, to die, death,

departure, 'the time of my death'

ἐφύστηκεν

PfAI3sg

fr. ἐφύστημι

to be before one as an event about to occur, be imminent, 'the time of my departure is imminent, cf. v. 2, Acts 28:2

to occur with high probability at a point of time just subsequent to another point of time, imminent, impending, 'the time of my departure is very near'

### V. 7

καλόν

pertaining to being in accordance at a high level with the purpose of something, or someone, good, useful, in any respect unobjectionable, blameless, excellent

pertaining to a positive moral quality, with the implication of being favorably valued, good, fine, praiseworthy

ἀγῶνα

a struggle against opposition, struggle, fight, 'fight a fight, engage in a contest'

to engage in intense struggle, involving physical or nonphysical force against strong opposition, to struggle, to fight

ἠγώνισμαι

PfM/PdepI1sg

fr. ἀγωνίζομαι

to fight, struggle, figuratively of any struggle, cf. 1 Tim. 4:10, Col. 1:29, 4:12

to engage in intense struggle, involving physical or nonphysical force against strong opposition, to struggle, to fight

δρόμον

movement on a path from one point to another, course, of a race in a figurative context

the course that one follows in a race, course, race, 'I have finished the race' figurative

τετέλεκα                      PfAI1sg                      fr. τελεω  
to complete an activity or process, bring to an end, finish, complete  
to bring an activity to a successful finish, to complete, to finish, to end, to accomplish

πίστιν  
that which is believed, body of faith/belief/teaching, cf. Rom. 12:6  
to believe in the good news about Jesus Christ and to become a follower, to be a believer, to be a Christian, Christian faith

τετήρηκα                      PfAI1sg                      fr. τηρεω  
to cause a state, condition, or activity to continue, keep, hold, reserve, preserve someone or something, of holding on to something so as not to give it up or lose it, cf. Eph. 4:3  
to continue to obey orders or commandments, to obey, to keep commandments, obedience

## V. 8

λοιπὸν  
from now on, in the future, henceforth, ‘for the future there is reserved for me’  
pertaining to the part of a whole which remains or continues, and thus constitutes the rest of the whole, rest, remaining, what remains, other

ἀπόκειται                      PM/PdepI3sg                      fr. ἀποκειμαι  
to reserve as award or recompense, reserve, ‘a crown is reserved for me’  
to exist, with the implication of having been established and thus having continuity and purpose,  
to exist, to exist for, to be set

δικαιοσύνης  
the quality or characteristic of upright behavior, uprightness, righteousness, of uprightness in general  
the act of doing what God requires, righteousness, doing what God requires, doing what is right

στέφανος  
award or prize for exceptional service or conduct, prize, reward, figurative  
a prize or reward given as the result of outstanding performance, prize, reward, ‘the prize of righteousness awaits me’

ἀποδώσει                      FAI3sg                      fr. ἀποδιδωμι  
to give out, give, give up, yield, ‘award a crown’  
to recompense someone, whether positively or negatively, depending upon what the individual deserves, to reward, to recompense

## δίκαιος

pertaining to being in accordance with high standards of rectitude, upright, just, fair, of transcendent beings. Because of their privileged status as authority figures, the idea of fairness or equity is associated with such entities, of God  
pertaining to being in accordance with what God requires, righteous, just

## κριτής

one who has the right to render a decision in legal matters, a judge, of God  
one who presides over a court session and pronounces judgment, judge, ‘the crown of righteousness is waiting for me, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give me on that day’

## ἠγαπηκόσι

PfAPtcpMPD

fr. ἀγαπαω

to have high esteem for or satisfaction with something, take pleasure in  
to have love for someone or something, based on sincere appreciation and high regard, to love, to regard with affection, loving concern, love

## ἐπιφάνειαν

act of appearing, appearance, of Jesus, of his appearance in judgment, cf. v. 1, 1 Tim. 6:14, Titus 2:13, 2 Thes. 2:8

to appear to someone or at some place, to appear, appearance, appearing, ‘and to all those who love his appearing’
