Title:

Numbers- referring to the census and the two occasions of counting the people

Hebrew Title- "In the Desert"- (1:1)

Author:

Anonymous, attributed to Moses

Occasion and Purpose:

Written at the Exodus for the new nation to understand their identity, heritage and responsibility.

A record of Israel's failure as a warning to not repeat their unfaithfulness. A record of God's faithfulness as an encouragement that the promises have not failed and will not fail, even in spite of Israel's unfaithfulness.

Themes:

1. Faith and Obedience
2. Rebellion and Punishment
3. God's Faithfulness

Summary:

Continuation of the story of Israel moving out of Egypt into the Holy Land. God prepared them to move immediately into the promised land, but because of their rebellion, they were forced to continue in the desert for 40 years. The story of their wanderings, victories and preparation for entering the land God had promised.
