- How did God respond when Moses asked His Name? What does this teach us about God and His Nature and character? What does this tell us about His purposes?
- What was the purpose of the plagues in Egypt? How do we know this from Exodus? What did the plagues demonstrate? What does Exodus tell us about the result that happened because of the plagues? What difference should this make in our relationship with God?
- How is the Passover related to the plagues? What happened in the first Passover? How was that to be commemorated by the Hebrews? What does it point forward to? What does this tell us about God’s ultimate purposes? What difference does this make?
- What was significant about the firstborn in the Exodus? Why?
- What was the route that Israel took out of Egypt? Why?
- What did God do at the Red Sea? Why? What does this reveal about God? How did Exodus summarize the theological point of the Red Sea crossing? How did Israel respond? How does this apply today?
- Why did the people complain in the desert? What does this show about human nature? How can we protect ourselves from doing the same?
- How did God respond to the people complaining? What does this teach about God? How should we respond?

## Themes

- Explain each of the theological themes in your own words. What does each say about the content, message and significance of the Exodus? How should each idea be applied in current life?
- What is God's NAME? What about God was revealed in Exodus in relation to His NAME? How does this apply?
- What was revealed about God in the way that He rescued His people from Egypt? What does this tell us about the way He relates to His people? What difference does this make?
