- Why was the capture of Jerusalem significant?
- Describe each of the promises contained in the Davidic Covenant. How was each promise fulfilled in history? What does this tell us about the larger Old Testament story? How does this apply to current Christian life?
- How did David complete the conquest? Why is this significant? What does this tell us about Israel at that point of history?
- What was David’s sin and why did he commit it? What should we learn from this? How should we apply it? How was contrast faithfulness demonstrated in this episode?
- How did David respond when he was confronted with his sin? What consequences did he suffer? How is this significant?
- Describe what happened in David’s family after his sin. How were these things related to David’s sin? How did David’s guilt handicap his ability to deal with these things rightly?
- What is the evaluation the Lecture gives of David’s reign? What point is made about the kind of king Israel needed? How does that apply to us today?
- How did David’s rule end? How does that prepare for what will follow?

- Explain each of the theological themes in your own words. What does each tell us about the content, message and significance of 2 Samuel? How should each idea be applied in current life?
- How is Deuteronomistic Theology demonstrated in 2 Samuel? What difference does this make?
