- What were the surrounding countries and how did they interact with God's people at this time? Why is that significant for the Old Testament story?
- What are the reasons that these books give for the punishment of the two kingdoms?
- Who were the prophets and what function did they serve at this time?
- What did Elijah do? What lessons should we learn from his story? How do they apply?
- What did Elisha do? What is significant about that?

- Explain each of the theological themes in your own words. What does each tell us about the content, message and significance of 1 & 2 Kings? How should each idea be applied in current life?
- How is Deuteronomistic Theology demonstrated in Kings? What difference does this make?
- Define what is meant by “prophetic perspective.” How is this demonstrated in 1 & 2 Kings? Why is this significant? How should you apply this insight in your own life and ministry?
