Background

Content

- What are the key verses of Ecclesiastes? What does each highlight? What does each tell us about the overall content and message of Ecclesiastes?
- Describe the meaning of the word “meaningless/vanity.” How does this express the teaching of Ecclesiastes? What should we learn from this? How does it apply?
- What is the attitude of Ecclesiastes toward God? How does it suggest we should think about and act toward God? How should we respond?
- What is the “conclusion – the bottom line” of Ecclesiastes? How does this help us understand the rest of the book? How does this apply to modern life?

Themes

- Explain each of the theological themes in your own words. What does each tell us about the content, message and significance of Ecclesiastes? What does each tell us about God and how we should relate to Him? How should each idea be applied in current life?
- What is the significance of the phrase “under the sun”? What difference does this make?
- Explain in your own words how joy can be a theme of a book like Ecclesiastes, which seems so depressing? What does this tell us about the meaning and message of this book?
- How does the fear of the Lord give answers to the questions posed in this book? How is this similar to the conclusions reached in the earlier wisdom books? Why does this matter?

- Review the key themes of Ecclesiastes and work toward committing them to memory.
