- Explain each of the theological themes in your own words. What does each tell us about the content, message and significance of Daniel? How should each idea be applied in current life?
- How does the second theme give a powerful motivation for the first theme? How can we put this into practice?
- How are the third and fourth themes dependent on the second theme? How are they a demonstration of the second theme? What should we learn from this about our own situations? How does this apply?
